This training will help staff understand how to promote mental health, so they can contribute to Head Start programs that support the social and emotional development of children, families and their community. Participants will learn directions in how the strengths and abilities that characterize mental health can be encouraged and reinforced. Head Start staff do not always know the source of children's difficulties, they are keenly aware of the risks

that contribute to problem behaviors. Environmental factors such as poverty, community violence, exposure to substance abuse, and child abuse and neglect are key issues that negatively affect children's behavior. Regardless of the reasons, Agencies face an overarching challenge to find ways, with available resources to effectively meet the needs of children with significant emotional and behavioral problems.

LESSON 1: Mental Health Requirement

In this lesson you will learn how to implement the requirements set forth in the HS Performance standards. Students will learn the requirements to ensure that the service of a mental health professional(s) timely and effective.

This lesson you will understand the role of observing and recording children's behavior, identify and use a variety of observational methods, match observational goals to appropriate observational techniques and writ a running record accurately and objectively.
